Welcome to this month's Newsletter. The first days of October have certainly brought autumnal weather and several months' worth of rainfall in just a few days. We certainly need it, although perhaps not in such a short space of time!

As autumn is now with us, it's time to get the central heating on again and you will have seen workmen around the day centre and Heathcote House in recent weeks. On behalf of Orbit, they are building a new boiler room for Heathcote House so that the heating and hot water systems can be separated from the day centre. We expressed concerns to West Suffolk Council, who own the Day Centre, that whilst Orbit were getting new boilers for Heathcote House, they were planning on leaving the Day Centre with the old heating system that had really seen better days and required regular maintenance to keep it working. You will no doubt share in our gratitude when we discovered that Orbit have installed two shiny new boilers, just for the Day Centre! These should ensure we are all warm this winter and for many winters to come. Our thanks go to Orbit and West Suffolk Council.

We were delighted that Brandon was awarded a Gold in the 'Anglia in Bloom' awards. Judges visited several sites across the town, travelling in an old London Routemaster double decker bus. When they arrived at the Day Centre later in the afternoon, they were pleased to see the beautifully painted pots and hanging baskets and the shrubs and larger pots around the entrance. It certainly was blooming on the day of the judging thanks to Andrea and her helpers! The 'Brandon in Bloom' organisers are already beginning to plan for next year's awards, so watch this space for details.

Day Care volunteer, Katy, has finished writing up the feedback from the questionnaires many of you completed with her during the summer. She will be sharing the feedback with the care team and with members over the next few weeks.
