Some of the customers and staff have already tried the screen with colouring and sensory games. We can't wait to use the interactive screen more in the future and will be running a film afternoon which has been requested by some of the customers.

We are so pleased to have this piece of kit to enjoy, it makes a great addition to the programme of activities we can offer.


If you didn't manage to guess who last issue's little girl was, it was staff member

The missing word was Crackers.




